Liberty Learning Center's Policy on the Use of Technology and Social Media

For purposes of the following guidelines, interactive media are devices such as tablets, computers, cell phones, touch screens and handheld game systems.

Non-interactive media are televisions, DVD and videos.

Interactive media will be provided to use by staff at a computer station. The only computer connected to the internet is the computer behind the teacher's desk and internet is NOT available to any other computer at Liberty Learning Center. No interactive media from an outside source (ex. Home) will be allowed. Limits on computer screen time will be determined based on class siize and time constraints but will not exceed 15 minutes.

Non-interactive media shall be limited to no more than 30 minutes per day for full time childcare students and 15 minutes per day for Preschool/Pre-Kindergarten and School age students.

It is understood that as technology advances, there will be a need for digital literacy to be addressed in the classroom. We believe that without supervision and guidelines, usage can interfere with learning and decrease development of language and social skills.
